

# Missouri State Best Youth Program Brochure

**Due Date:** Entry must be received by the State Youth Activities Chair no later than April 30, 2023

All Lodges across the state have programs honoring the youth in their communities, but not all take the time to put a brochure together to enter the **Missouri State Youth Program Brochure Contest**. The contest can be a rewarding experience. You should use all the available avenues to make your local youth programs a success. Publicity resulting from these activity for your Lodge and the Order cannot be overestimated and in many ways is the key to gaining new members for the Order.

**Lodges will be divided into six groups with the following membership breakdown:**

**Division 1** – Lodges with 150 or fewer members; **Division 2** – Lodges with 151 to 225 members; **Division 3** – Lodges with 226 to 300 members; **Division 4** – Lodges with 301 to 450 members; **Division 5** – Lodges with 451 to 700 members; **Division 6** – Lodges with 701 or more members.

State Awards will be made to the Lodges which sponsored and maintained the best Youth Programs during the Lodge year (April 1-March 31) just completed the preceding Session.

## **To Qualify:**

No brochure may be over 18 pounds in weight, nor exceed 15 inches by 18 inches in size and 5 inches in thickness, including cover.

Entries should include a Table of contents with page tabs and pages numbered to correspond with the table of contents. Please identify each section with a title page.

All Lodge contest brochures must include a letter from the Lodge Secretary verifying membership as of March 31st of that Lodge Year.

## **Food for thought:**

Combine many pictures (color photos preferred) and captions, of the same event, on the same page when possible. *Captions are an important part of the overall presentation and should clearly describe the picture.*

Awards banquets are more important than picnics. Banquets have a captive audience for introductions, whereas picnics are usually scattered, but both can and should be a part of the overall program.

Limit 10 pages maximum on each event. Remember: Quality not quantity. Avoid form letters or blank Grand

Lodge forms/certificates.

A Gun Show is not Youth Activities.

Pictures should not contain tables or individuals with drinks or beer bottles in hand.
